Change Research, a national research firm that has conducted more than 3,000 polls of over 3 million people since 2017, conducted a survey in Nevada's 2nd congressional district March 9-12, 2024. A total of 735 likely general election voters were interviewed online, and the survey has a modeled margin of error of 3.9 percentage points. Post-stratification weighting was performed on age, race/ethnicity, sex, education, region, and 2020 presidential vote. Weighting parameters were based on voter file data. Republican Congressman Mark Amodei Is a Weak Incumbent

Longtime member of Congress Mark Amodei is not particularly well-known or well-liked among likely 2024 voters. Just 56% know him well enough to have an opinion of the Congressman, who has been a legislator since he was first elected to the Nevada Assembly in 1996. Among those who *do* have an opinion, the proportion of voters who view Amodei favorably (28%) is equivalent to the proportion who view him unfavorably (27%), and those who view him favorably don't feel strongly about him: just 10% of the 28% have a *very* favorable opinion. In contrast, half (49%) of likely voters hold a favorable opinion of Donald Trump, including 33% who view Trump *very* favorably.

Even Republican voters are lukewarm on Amodei. Just over half (55%) know him well enough to have an opinion, and only 17% hold a *very* favorable opinion of the Congressman.



Independent Challenger Greg Kidd Is Poised to Gain Significant Ground Against Amodei

Independent candidate Greg Kidd, a successful fintech businessman with experience as a senior analyst at the Federal Reserve, trails Amodei on the initial ballot, 26% to 44%. But with one in three (31%) likely voters undecided, and with both candidates relatively unknown (just 6% of likely voters know Kidd well enough to have an opinion of him), this race is open for movement.





After reading balanced biographical statements on both candidates, Kidd closes the initial gap to 10 points. Simulating a balanced spending environment with 3 positive messages on each candidate, 3 negatives on Kidd and 4 negatives on Amodei, Amodei's lead narrows to just 5 points: 44% to Kidd's 39%, with 17% undecided.

The Path to Victory for Greg Kidd

Key to a Kidd victory is speaking to Amodei's out-of-step issue positions and offering northern Nevadans a fresh alternative to Washington insider Mark Amodei. Consolidate Democrats and Independent voters around women's reproductive freedom and other personal liberties. Rally around Republican voters' intense desire for congressional term limits (90% of likely voters in the district say they are more likely to vote for a candidate who will impose congressional term limits) while highlighting Kidd's outsider vision–and *plan*–for creating and sustaining northern Nevada's economic future. With adequate resources behind communication efforts, all portions of the electorate are ripe for movement toward Kidd over Amodei.
